Competence of tribunals in industrial property matters and enforcement at defendent's domicile of judgements rendered in the country of the protection

Resolutions

1. The Executive Committee of OSLO has considered that the Union Convention did not provide for any penalties for violations of rights in industrial property matters.

The Executive Committee was of the opinion that the extension of international law to cover the rights of industrial property was of importance and that the Association had a part to take in its study.

It has therefore recommended to maintain the question proposed by Dr. TROLLER.

- 2. The Executive Committee has established a questionnaire to facilitate further research, and it has desired the Groups to reply to the different questions there indicated.
- 3. The Executive Committee has finally expressed the opinion that the two questions raised by the Finnish and German Groups should be joined to the present question, namely:
- Should any rules of the conflict of laws and on jurisdictional competence be formed to cover acts of unfair competition committed in one country and having their unlawful effect in another country (German Group)?
- Should any rules making a certain law applicable in the case of a conflict of laws be introduced for disputes connected with patent law: inventions of employees, assignments and licences, etc. (Finnish Group)?
